Definition

Collaboration requires cooperation among team members focused on a shared task or goal that leads to an agreed-upon outcome. A collaborative team will generally have defined roles for team members who will work together until the goal is achieved or priorities change.

Framing Language

This rubric is specifically designed to evaluate collaboration and team work in a progression of skills, from basic to more complex. This rubric best applies to group projects where everyone contributes, takes responsibility, and values others' viewpoints.

Glossary

The definitions that follow were developed to clarify terms and concepts used in this rubric only.

- Relevant Information: Information that is pertinent, applicable, and essential in the solution of a problem.
- **Reflective listening**: A communication strategy that seeks to understand a speaker's idea by offering the idea back to the speaker, to confirm the idea has been understood correctly.
